

ORDINANCE NO. 7b
OF THE BOROUGH OF MILL VILLAGE
ERIE COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA

An ordinance relating to Disorderly Conduct.

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Council of the Borough of Mill Village, of the County of Erie, and State of Pennsylvania, as follows:

SECTION I. It shall be unlawful and shall constitute disorderly conduct for any person or persons within the limits of the Borough of Mill Village or upon the property of the Borough within or without of the Borough limits:

- #1. To be guilty of a breach of the peace by engaging in fighting or inciting others to fight, or to engage in any unlawful act tending to imperil the personal security of any person or persons, or to endanger or injure any property, real, personal, or mixed.
- #2. To use loud, boisterous, profane, blasphemous, indecent, or immoral language, which is annoying and disturbing to persons in public or to nearby residents.
- #3. To commit any lewd or indecent public acts, or to be guilty of public drunkenness which causes annoyance and disturbance to the public.
- #4. To loaf, loiter, stand, or place **one's** self upon any of the sidewalks or other public highways or places so as to annoy or interfere with the free and full passage of residents or travelers.
- #5. To set up, maintain, open or conduct: any gambling place or gambling device, any immoral show, entertainment, or exhibition, and unlawful drinking place or resort, or any house of prostitution; or to be gathered in or participate in the operation of the same, or to be a patron thereof.
- #6. To carry concealed weapons, unless authorized by law, or to discharge any weapon or device, capable of inflicting physical injury, in a disorderly or reckless manner.
- #7. To resist arrest by a Borough Police Officer or in any way interfere with his performance of duty.
- #8. To interfere with the proper performance of the Fire Department.
- #9. To injure, destroy, or tamper with the property of the Police Department, the Fire Department, or the Borough; or to in any way interfere with the proper performance of the Police Department, the Fire Department, the Mayor, or the Borough Council.

SECTION II. Any person or persons violating any provision of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof in a summary proceeding before the Mayor or any Justice of the Peace, be subject to a fine not exceeding Fifty (\$50.00) Dollars for each offense and, in default of the payment thereof, to imprisonment in the County Jail for a period not exceeding thirty (30) days.
